
WHAT TYPE OF BUILDING IS IT?

This fact sheet is limited to the QBCC licensing classification of Builder, e.g. Low Rise, Medium Rise and Open Builder



This list provides the definitions of Building Classes as set out in the Building Code of Australia.

CLASSES OF BUILDING	
velling being a detached house, or one of a group of two or more attached dwellings, each being a parated by a fire-resisting wall, including a row house, terrace house, town house or villa unit.	
house, guest house, hostel or the like with a total area of all floors not exceeding 300m², and where han 12 people reside, and is not located above or below another dwelling or another Class of building a private garage.	
more sole-occupancy units each being a separate dwelling.	
er than a Class 1 or 2 building, which is a common place of long term or transient living for a number inple: boarding-house, hostel, backpackers accommodation or residential part of a hotel or motel or g, or guest house, or residential care detention centre.	
at is Class 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 if it is the only dwelling in the building.	
professional or commercial purposes, excluding buildings of Class 6, 7, 8 or 9.	
A shop or other building for the sale of goods by retail or the supply of services direct to the public. Example: café, restaurant, kiosk, hairdressers, showroom or service station.	
which is a car park.	
which is for storage or display of goods or produce for sale by wholesale.	
in which a handicraft or process for the production, assembling, altering, repairing, packing, ods or produce for sale takes place.

re building, including those parts of the building set aside as a laboratory and includes a healthcare ed as a residential care building.	
ly building, including a trade workshop, laboratory or the like, in a primary or secondary school, but my other parts of the building that are of another class. Also, cinemas, churches, night clubs and res.

or structure.	
table structure including, private garage, carport, shed or the like.	
being a fence, mast, antenna, retaining or free standing wall, swimming pool or the like.	
ushfire shelter.	

NOTE: The classification of buildings and the type of construction can vary from the standard model depicted in the tables. Limitations are imposed under QBCC licensing requirements, related to maximum floor area and type of construction. See page 3.
